Name	Visions Journal Editorial Board
Vision	Visions Journal has an advisory structure that ensures it is a relevant, knowledge-sharing resource that improves the mental health and substance use literacy of its readers
Mission	To have a formal advisory structure to gather perspectives and ideas from a diverse range of stakeholders representing core audiences of our readership
Guiding principles	 Members are expected to: Respect the purpose of the BC Partners to empower individuals and families with evidence-based information and skills to promote well-being and help prevent and manage mental health and substance use problems. Understand that the Editorial Board is an advisory board to the Editor in Chief and final decisions about articles are made by the Canadian Mental Health Association and/or in special cases, by BC Partners management meetings Engage in respectful and open communication at all times Contribute ideas and discussion at meetings they attend Draw on their personal and professional experiences but do not claim them to represent all experiences or scientific fact Declare conflicts of interest, especially when raising ideas related to for-profit products or services Read published Visions issues to better understand our goals A member will be warned if they fail to comply with these principles and may be removed from the Editorial Board before their term is up

Objectives	As a group, to freely brainstorm possible topics, angles, contributors, stakeholders broadly keeping in mind the following lenses that Visions considers: • Well-being and prevention • Mental illness • Substance use or addictive behaviours • Concurrent issues • Age • Culture • Gender • Geography • Individuals with direct experience • Family and friends • Service providers • Policy and systems
Scope of duties	 The Canadian Mental Health Association is responsible for coordinating production of Visions Journal including securing submissions. The scope of duties for other members are to: Suggest specific areas of focus based on the issue theme Suggest topic-specific guest editors to join each issue Provide background experiences or expertise for the editorial board Identify possible programs, research, innovations or topics to feature in <i>Visions</i> Identify possible writers or contributors for <i>Visions</i>
Reports to	 BC Partners members report back to the leadership structure at their individual organizations and to the BC Partners management meetings chaired by BC Mental Health and Substance Use Services Other volunteer members report to organizations or networks they represent and to the Visions Editor in Chief
Membership and Terms	 A representative from each of the 7 member agencies of the BC Partners for Mental Health and Substance Use Information A special Guest Editor for each issue, identified as having special expertise and connections 3-6 external members who are accepted through an application process
Terms	External members' terms are for one year and may be renewed for another year. Other members' terms are ongoing

Communication	 Notice of upcoming meetings will be sent to members usually around 2 weeks in advance Notes from each meeting's brainstorm are circulated the week after each meeting
Meeting frequency	Quarterly 90 minute meetings held during working hours based on availability of Guest Editor
Attendance at meetings	 In person or by toll-free teleconference Members are required to attend 2 of 4 meetings a year Members are advised to contact the Editor if there are times of day or days of the week where they would <i>consistently</i> be unavailable
Compensation	 Members of BC Partners are compensated for participation as part of their annual contracts External members receive a \$75 annual honoraria after participation in two meetings Travel expenses to attend meetings are not compensated above the honoraria, with the exception of some Guest Editors Members who are approached to write a personal experience article for Visions, if they are writing outside their job role, would be eligible for a \$75 honorarium after publishing
